

A word from our Pastor

Happy fall, Pomona Fellowship! Please enjoy this scientifically-based discussion from the Salt Project on the beautiful foliage we are starting to see:

The brilliant colors of creation are often biologically helpful, sometimes in more ways than one. A coral reef's vibrant palette protects against the sun's ultraviolet rays, and at the same time helps the coral attract mates. The bright hues of flowers lure pollinating insects and birds.

So what about the colors of fall foliage?

Many leaves contain yellow and orange pigments all year round, but in the spring and summer they're masked by the vivid greens of chlorophyll, the pigment responsible for the absorption of light to provide energy for photosynthesis. But as the days shorten and the temperature falls, the chlorophyll breaks down and drains away — and those yellows and oranges begin to shine through. They were there all along, quiet and unnoticed, but now they emerge as the green curtain fades. If God is a painter of autumn trees, what we see is an art not of addition but of subtraction. It's an art of revelation, of revealing the hidden beauty of what was already there.

But what about those stunning reds? Those pigments appear when the leftover sugars in certain leaves are transformed into anthocyanins, red and purple pigments. And that transformation, incidentally, is most intense where there is the most light — which is why the leaves (or even the *parts* of leaves) most bathed in sunlight are the most deeply red of all. Ditto for the sunny sides of apples; that's where the crimsons emerge. Like coral in the ocean, the reds and purples help protect leaves from the Sun's power as the chlorophyll drains away. As it turns out, then, the Divine Artist paints not only by revelation, but also by transformation and protection.

So the next time you take a walk or a bike ride through a landscape alive with changing fall foliage, recall that this grand spectacle — arguably one of the most beautiful annual changes in the world — is a sheer riot of divine glory, a tide of

splendor flooding the world with revelation (the yellows and oranges) and transformative protection (the reds and purples).

A divine sermon in pigment and light, shimmering for all who have eyes to see.



1) Mission and Ministry Board approves new Global Mission Development Fund at its Fall 2024 meeting

The Church of the Brethren's Mission and Ministry Board held its Fall 2024 meeting Oct. 17-20 at the denomination's General Offices in Elgin, Ill. Colin Scott presided as chair, assisted by chair-elect Kathy Mack and general secretary David Steele.

Actions were taken on a proposal for a new Global Mission Development Fund, a proposal for revision of the Health Education and Research Fund, the naming

of new board leadership, and Germantown Trust appointments. Also on the agenda, among other items, were a year-to-date financial update for 2024, a board growth session focused on the Strategic Plan's goal of "Seeking God's Racial Justice," an envisioning time to discuss "The Church of Tomorrow," and reports.

2) Standing Committee meets by Zoom to adopt agency covenants

The Standing Committee of district delegates to the Church of the Brethren Annual Conference met via Zoom on the evening of Sept. 30 to consider and act on covenants with the three agencies of Annual Conference—Bethany Theological Seminary, Eder Financial, and On Earth Peace. Also acted on was a recommendation to Annual Conference to renew their agency status.

3) Coalition sends letter calling on senators to support joint resolutions of disapproval on arms sales to Israel

The Church of the Brethren's Office of Peacebuilding and Policy is one of more than 100 faith-based and humanitarian organizations signing a letter to the senators in the US Congress urging them to cosponsor and vote in favor of four joint resolutions of disapproval introduced by Senators Sanders, Welch, and Merkley regarding several specific major arms sales to Israel.

In August, the Biden administration approved a series of arms sales to Israel totaling more than \$20 billion. The joint resolutions of disapproval would block

the sale of many offensive weapons that have been used in strikes that have killed thousands of civilians in Gaza over the last year



5) Pastors' Housing Equity Fund is coming

The newly revised pastors' Housing Equity Fund now offers a tax-friendly option for those ministers living in parsonages who wish to build equity toward a future home purchase. Significant revisions to the fund's structure were approved by the 2024 Annual Conference and have resulted in the creation of this new investment fund option.

Whereas the former fund had unfavorable tax consequences for those invested monies donated by congregations, the soon-to-be-arriving fund offers more desirable options that are now managed by Eder Financial.

6) WCC advocates for creation care and justice at start of triple COP journey

A release from the World Council of Churches

The World Council of Churches (WCC) begins its journey at the triple COPs—starting with the biodiversity COP16 in Colombia—by promoting a holistic approach to environmental stewardship. COP stands for Conference of the Parties and often refers to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) international meetings focusing on climate.

Biodiversity COP16, from Oct. 21 to Nov. 1, marks the first of three major international environmental conferences. The WCC will also participate in the climate COP29 in Azerbaijan on Nov. 11-22, and the desertification COP16 in Saudi Arabia on Dec. 2-13.

"We are advocating for solutions that honor the interconnectedness of creation and recognize biodiversity as a cornerstone of ecological and human resilience," said Jerry Pillay, WCC general secretary. "Environmental justice is not just a matter of policy but a spiritual and moral responsibility. We are called to address these interconnected crises with urgency, rooted in faith, to ensure a

future where all of creation can thrive."


7) FaithX 2025 locations and dates are announced
